



My child has never played hockey before. Where do I begin?

Step 1: Pre Hockey (Tots/LTS)

This introductory class is where skaters will learn basic skating skills such as two foot glides, forward swizzles, back wiggles, and stopping.

Step 2: Hockey Learn to Skate

This class focuses on more advanced skating skills to prepare the skater for our learn to play hockey program. Skaters will learn terminology and further develop balance and skating technique.

Step 3: Learn to Play Hockey

Skaters will continue to develop their skating while working on stick and puck handling, shooting, and will include small area games to help reinforce these techniques.
